
Indonesian International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA) is a scholarship scheme by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia in collaboration with Indonesian Education Endowment Fund (LPDP) to fund Indonesian students for a one semester-mobility program at top universities and reputable industries overseas. Offering two schemes for undergraduate and vocational students, IISMA will expose Indonesian students to international academic and cultural diversity. Students can spend one semester (4-6 months) at the overseas partner university to study, to experience the host country's culture and undertake practical assignments to hone their skills.

UNIVERSITIES PREFERENCE

- **International Recognition** University reputation based on QS 2022 Rankings standard.
- **Country and Region** Selection from different countries to enhance program diversity.
 - **Program Values** Host university's ability to provide programs and courses that match criteria set by MoECRT.

CRITERIA FOR UNDERGRADUATE PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

IISMA partner university must:

- be accredited/recognized in their country
- be ranked in top 10 in their country (based on QS WUR) or in top 300 QS WUR
- experienced in hosting international students
- offer courses in English
- be flexible in developing the program









CRITERIA FOR PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

IISMA partner university must:

- offer monthly-payment accommodation (without meal plan) for IISMA Awardees, as well
- organize and facilitate cultural events for the students.
- provide any necessary services for international students. (e.g., pastoral care, airport transportation, student counselling, student buddies/mentors orientation co-curricular/extra-curricular activities, accommodation, travel information and immigration).
- agree to avoid disputes resolution through any court and international arbitration; and agree to resolve any disputes through mutual consultation.
- agree to finalize contract of IISMA one month after receiving the draft.



CRITERIA FOR PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

IISMA partner university must:

- organize undergraduate level classes/courses with the following requirements:
 - Students take 3 4 courses for one semester
 - The courses must meet IISMA's expected learning outcomes
 - Students spend one semester (4 6 months, 16 meetings per course)
 - · Students can learn any subjects of their interests beyond their field of study at home university.
- provide unconditional letter of acceptance, transcript, certificate of participation, and student progress report issued upon completion.
- provide enrollment requirements such as GPA and English Proficiency.
- accept TOEFL iBT, IELTS or Duolingo Test.
- agree to accept list of IISMA awardees. No additional selection process by host university required.



Scottish Studies: Conceptualizing Scotland (20 credits)

Course description:

An introduction to the study of culture, society and tradition in Scotland, with the emphasis on de-constructing competing conceptions and images of the nation. Theoretical approaches to the investigation of cultural construction, representation and expression are introduced through heritage, literature, folklore, music, song, visual art and the popular media. Students are also invited to consider the political context of cultural representation and investigate the interface between culture and industry




